

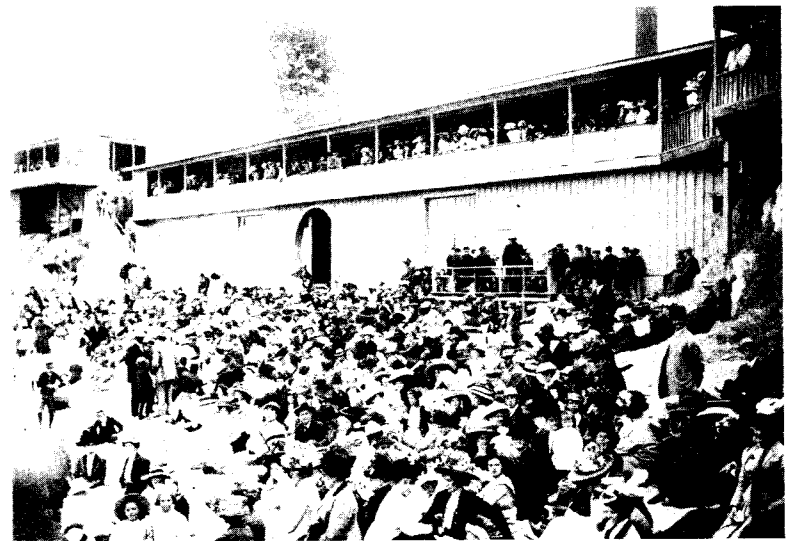

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Remembering . . .

(The following letter was received in February 1985)

"Dear Members:

We have a copy of "The Board and Batten" dated December/84 - January/85 sent to us by our friend of many years, Wini Hurlbert.

In the photo my sister, Elisabeth Bean Telfer, sent you of 183 - 8th St., 1903, I note that a small section of the "Tower House" near the foot of 7th St. (#106) shows through the lower porch and above the railing on the upper porch.

In the early 1900's the Washburn family lived there in the summertimes. The enclosed xerox copy of a photo shows Lowell Washburn with me and our home-made boat model on the deck of the "Tower House". I am the one with glasses.

I was born in San Jose in 1895. This photo must have been taken between 1900 and 1905.

I also have a photo showing part of the original Edward Berwick home but it is of poor quality. Edward Berwick was at one time the mayor of Pacific Grove. He was a neighbor of ours. We used to wonder at his swimming in the surf at the foot of 7th St. He would swim out 100 feet or so while we were learning to swim "dog fashion" close to the large rocks.

Elisabeth and I remember China Town and when it burned, it was visible from our house.

I used to deliver the San Francisco Bulletin to the old hotel located where Holmans is now. Renaldo Coe had the agency and I delivered

papers on the east side of town for him. He had a horse and a two-wheeled cart so (he) delivered on the west side of town. He went to West Point and was a colonel when killed while with General McArthur in the Philippies.

Keep up the good work.

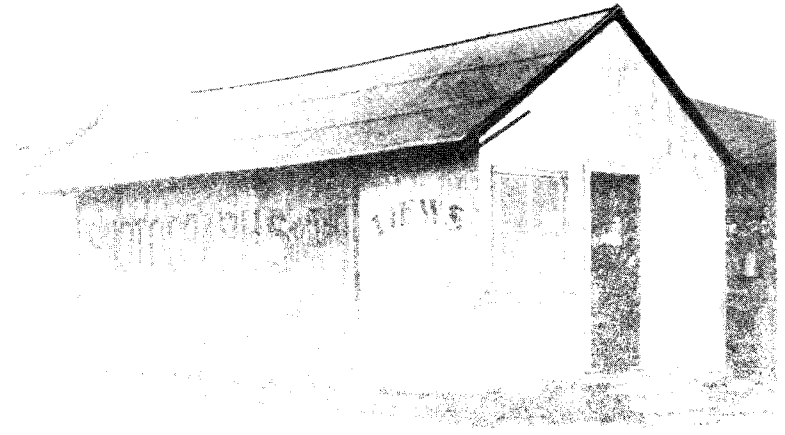
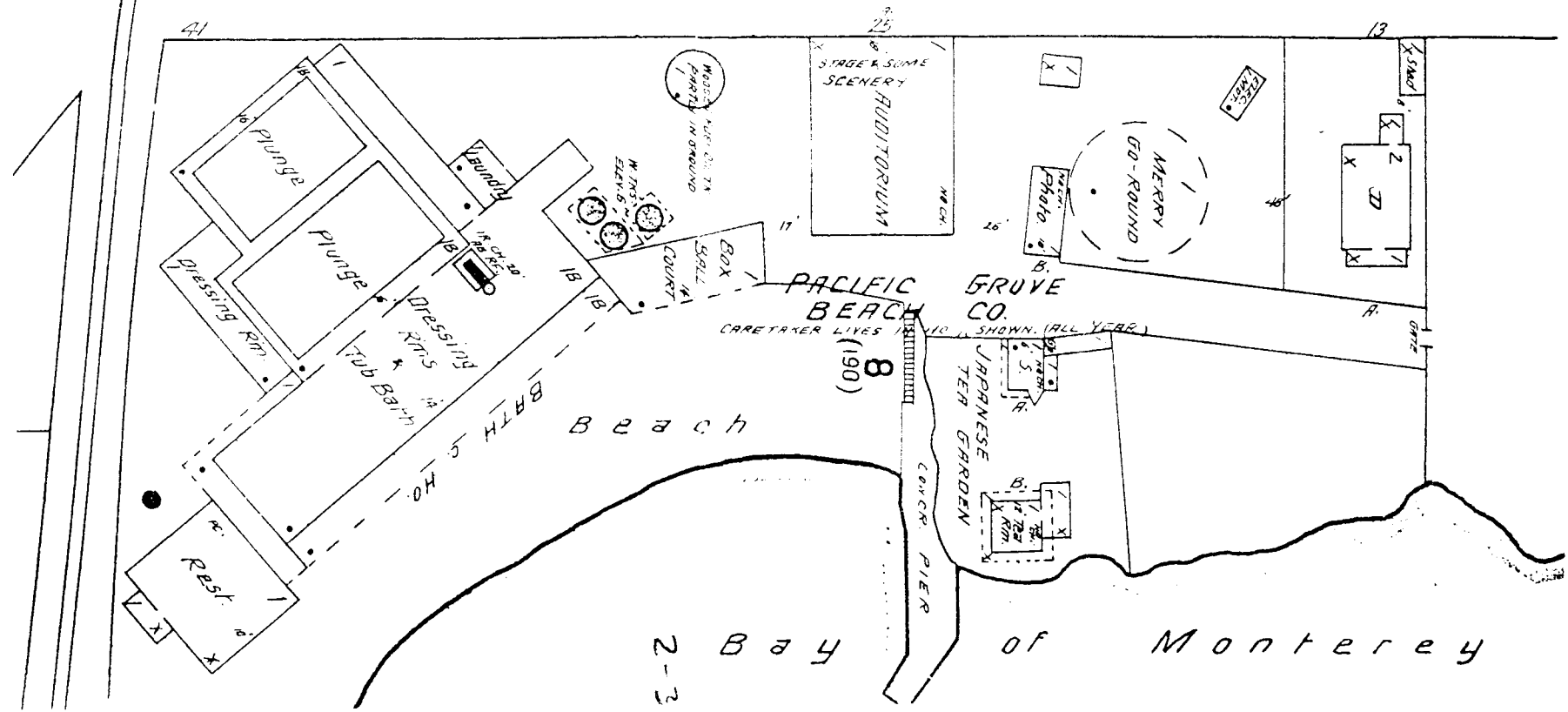
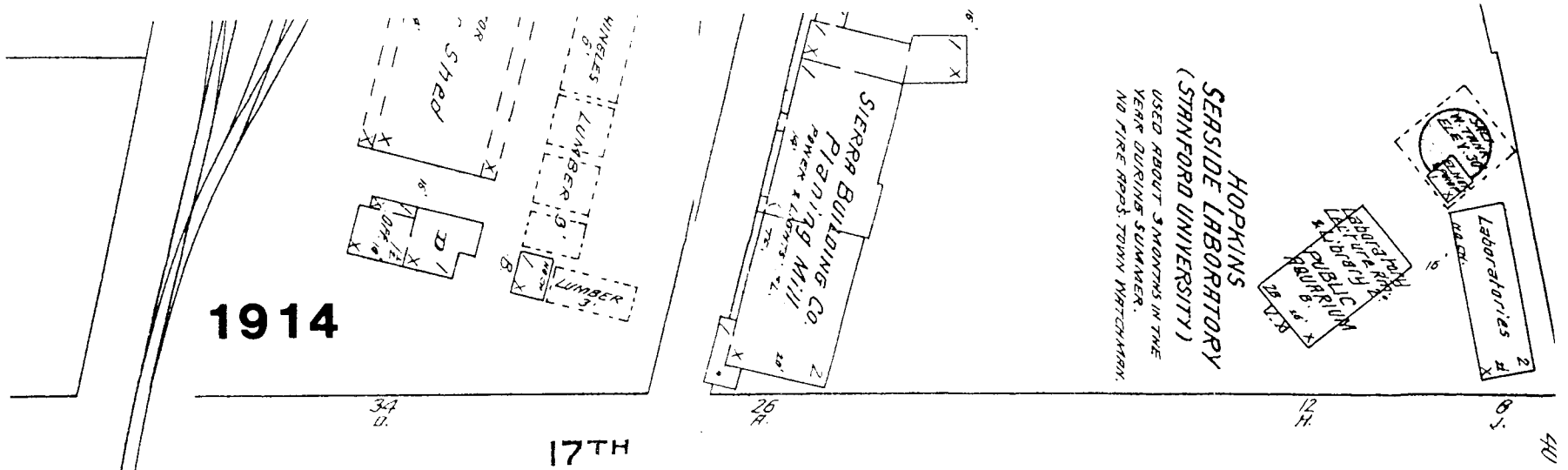


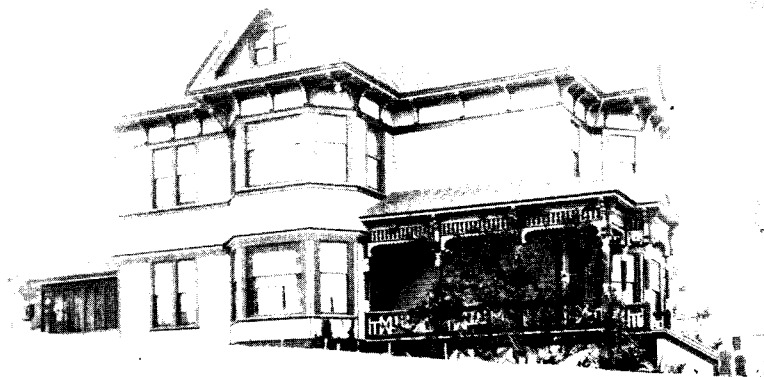
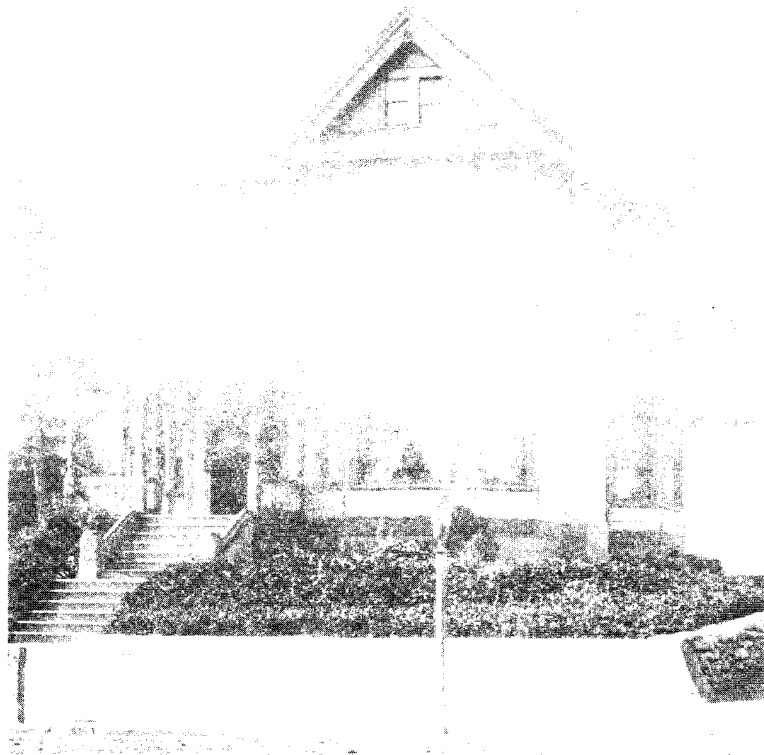
Photo Studio at Lover's Point. Note merry-go-round to the right. See centerfold map.

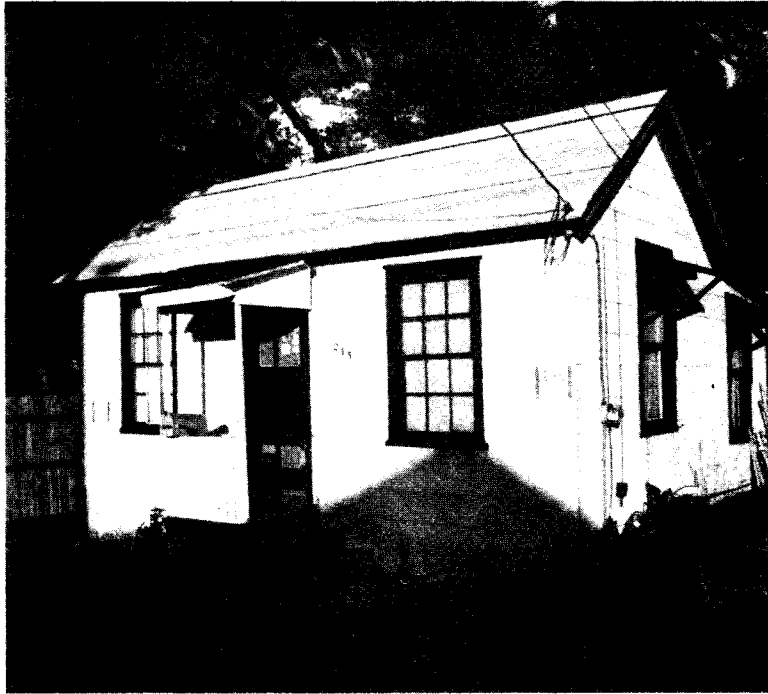
R.L. HOLMAN HOUSE
1889
769 Lighthouse

This home was built in 1889 as a three story wooden Victorian for R.L. Holman, founder and owner of Holman's Department Store, a fixture in downtown Pacific Grove until 1985 when it was sold to Ford's. The home remained in the Holman family until W.R. Holman's death in 1983, when the home was donated to the Monterey Peninsula Museum of Art. The home now houses the Administrative offices of the Museum on Wheel and the Conservator.

During the late 20's or early 30's, this Victorian mansion was converted to a Spanish Colonial Revival style residence, which was popular at the time. The top floor was removed and parts of the roof were hipped and covered with red tile. Steps up to the front door lead to a rounded-arch portico. The house also features large paned rounded-arch windows.

The above home, built between 1905 - 1914, was recently demolished as provided for in the recent demolition ordinance (see last issue). Representatives from the city (Tony Lobay, Director of Community Development and Dale Foley, Chief Building Inspector) and the Heritage Society (Adam Weiland, President and David Stocker, Vice President and Preservation Director) met at the house with the owner and agreed that the house could be demolished according to Section 2(b) of the interim demolition ordinance. The process is working!
