The survey of property owners in the Retreat has been completed and the results have been presented to the City Council.

The author of the survey, Ed Laurence, said that nearly a majority of the home owners polled (49%) favored the formation of some form of historical district in the retreat. These same people favored tax breaks for home rehabilitation and improvement (70%), an enforced demolition clause (64%) and an alternate building code for historical structures.
