The exhibit will feature two of the Grove's most noted historic scenes...the Chautauqua Hall and Lovers of Jesus Point.

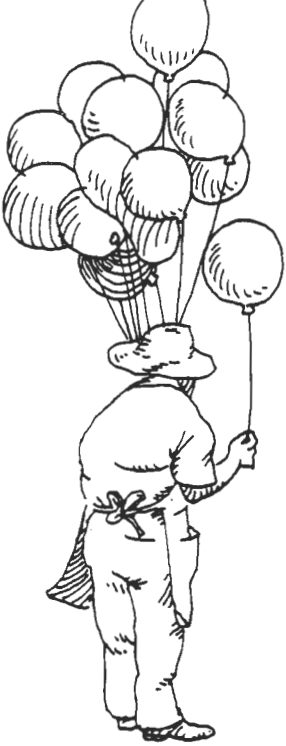

# Special Report

VOTERS: Are you informed?

Measure D is being submitted to the voters of Pacific Grove on November 3, 1981 for rejection or adoption.

Voting Yes will support passing Ordinance 1262 NS, while voting No rejects it.

The Ordinance would allow 32 condominium units to be built above a street-level commercial space on the Old Methodist Church lot. This is the equivalent of 58 units per acre..twice the 29 units previously allowed, and greater than the 26 and 29 units respectively allowed by Seaside and Monterey.

The Heritage Society encourages you to read your sample ballot prior to election day to familiarize yourself with the issues. But, it is particularly important that you go to the polls on November 3 and VOTE.

Members of the Board of Directors of the Heritage Society met with Sabastian Bordonaro, architect of the Plaza Project, on the eve of October 6 at The Barn to review suggested changes in the exterior design of the Project. Changes which might make it more compatible with its specifically Victorian surroundings. The results of this meeting are not, at this point, conclusive.
